Saskatchewan Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their employees are trained to work proficiently using telehandler machinery. The personnel should be assessed for their ability to utilize the equipment. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that employees get the necessary level of ability. The responsibility level of the individual needs to be taken into consideration when training is offered. Effective training would solve whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment at the completion of the training period will determine whether or not the learning goals have been met.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by federal, state/provincial and local regulators. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, the use of rotating equipment or the use of other attachments. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

The telehandler needs routine maintenance like any other machine. The equipment will wear out eventually, so proper maintenance is needed to guarantee the safe use of the telehandler machinery. Checks and inspections are vital to ongoing maintenance measures. Operators must have machine-specific training in order to rectify, monitor and prevent problems associated with damage, wear and deterioration. Employees need experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions must be viewed seriously and followed, taking into consideration such factors as environmental circumstances in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machinery along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally performed by the telehandler owner whilst pre-use inspections are typically done by the user.
