When operated by an inexperienced individual, a forklift can be very dangerous. To be able to reduce the risk of accident, potential operators have to undertake forklift training by a skilled instructor prior to operating a forklift. All parts of lift truck utilization are covered in training programs. The limitations and abilities of the machinery are covered, together with pre-operation checks, basic operating measures and methods of warning other workers that a forklift is in the work area.

Lessons comprise the placement of the trailer tires and chock blocks, the arrangement of pallets to spread out the load correctly, and inspections required before driving into a trailer at a dock location. Courses also consist of Material Safety Data Sheet (MSDS) training. Although not related directly to the use of a lift truck, MSDS training is important if an operator notices a leaking container or damages a container containing toxic materials. MSDS sheets list the products, their effects on people and correct methods of handling spills.
